

## Advisory for COVID-19 outbreak for Indian students in the UK

## 16 March 2020

- We have received confirmation from the Indian Government that there is now a travel restriction (the "restriction") on passengers travelling from UK, Turkey and member countries of the European Union and European Free Trade Association to India. This includes Indian citizens. The restriction comes into effect from 18 March 2020 and will be in force till 31 March 2020 (the "restriction period"). It will be reviewed subsequently.
- For passengers coming from or transiting through UAE, Qatar, Oman and Kuwait there will be a compulsory quarantine period of a minimum of 14 days with effect from 1200 GMT on 18 March 2020 at the port of first departure.
- If you already have a ticket to travel back to India and are impacted by this restriction, please contact your airline and/or intermediary through which you booked the ticket.
- 4. If your UK visa is due to expire during the restriction period or shortly thereafter, please seek advice from UKVI by contacting their Coronavirus Immigration Helpline at:
